### NOTES TO ACCOUNTS AS AT MARCH 31, 2014

#### I. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

1. Method of Accounting: The Society, generally, follows cash basis of accounting recognising all incomes on receipt basis and expenditure on payment

basis.

2. Fixed Assets: Fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation.

However assets purchased exclusively for a particular project (as per the terms of the project) are charged to the concerned

project account as utilization. Such assets are capitalized at a nominal amount of Rs. 1 in the accounts.

3. Depreciation: Depreciation has been provided on fixed assets based on written down value method as per the rates prescribed in the Income

Tax Act, 1961.

### II. NOTES:

1. No provision for taxation has been made in the accounts as the society is registered under section 12A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 and there is no tax liability after giving effect to sections 11 & 12 of the said Act.

2. Previous years' figures have been re-grouped/re-arranged to make them comparable with the figures of the current year.

3. Overhead Expenditure has been allocated by the Foundation to various Projects on the basis of budget of individual expenses approved by such Projects. Difference if any, of General Overhead charges over such allocated expenditure is being absorbed/credited in the books of account of the Foundation.
